This righteousness is twofold: the righteousness of Christ imputed to us by faith, which assures our standing with God, and practical righteousness—living a life that is morally upright and obedient to God's commands—which protects us from guilt and condemnation.
3. **The Sandals of the Gospel of Peace (v. 15):** Being shod with preparedness allows us to move with stability and purpose. The peace we have with God through the Gospel empowers us to stand firm amidst chaos and enables us to share the good news, which itself is an offensive action against the kingdom of darkness.
4. **The Shield of Faith (v. 16):** This is the defensive piece that quenches *all* the fiery darts of the wicked one. These "darts" are the accusations, doubts, fears, and temptations hurled at us. Faith—a trust in God's power and promises—is the only thing that can extinguish them completely.
5. **The Helmet of Salvation (v. 17):** This guards the mind, our most critical battlefield. Knowing that we are securely saved gives us the confidence and assurance necessary to fight. It protects us from the enemy's attempts to instill hopelessness, despair, and confusion about our identity in Christ.
6. **The Sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God (v. 17):** This is the sole offensive weapon. Like Jesus in the wilderness, we use Scripture to directly counter the enemy's lies. The Word of God, wielded skillfully and prayerfully, is powerful and effective against all demonic opposition.



Ultimately, putting on this armor is an act of submitting fully to Christ and drawing on the spiritual strength He provides. Only by being fully equipped—standing firm in Truth, guarded by Righteousness, mobile with Peace, shielded by Faith, secured in Salvation, and fighting with the Word—can we successfully withstand the relentless attacks and stand victorious in the day of evil.

The first, and foundational, piece of the spiritual armor described in Ephesians 6 is the **belt of truth**. Just as a physical belt secures a soldier's tunic and provides a base for other pieces of equipment, the spiritual belt of truth is the prerequisite for stability and readiness in the Christian life. 
